1. Who is tS-X?

tS-X, based in Tahilla, is responsible for the processing of personal data as set out in this privacy policy.

2. What data does tS-X process?

tS-X processes your personal data because you use my services and/or because you provide this data to me yourself (for example via email). I process the following data:

- First and last name
- Company name
- Address details (for invoicing purposes)
- Phone number and email address
- Bank account number (after engagement)

3. For what purpose?

I process this data exclusively for:

- Processing your payments.
- Contacting you to carry out the agreed services.
- Complying with legal obligations, such as tax retention requirements.

The processing of this data is based on the legal grounds of 'Performance of a contract' or 'Legal obligation'.

4. How long does tS-X retain data?

tS-X does not retain your data longer than strictly necessary. For invoicing data, I apply the statutory retention period of Revenue (7 years). Contact details of potential clients that do not result in an engagement are deleted after 1 year.

5. Sharing with third parties

tS-X does not sell your data to third parties. I only share data when this is necessary for the performance of our agreement (for example, a domain registration in your name) or to comply with a legal obligation.

6. No Cookies & Tracking

The tS-X website (ts-x.net) is a static website. I do not use tracking cookies, pixels, or any other form of automated profiling. Your visit to my website is completely anonymous.

7. Security

tS-X takes the protection of your data seriously and uses modern, static web architectures (without vulnerable databases) and encrypted connections (SSL) to prevent misuse, loss, or unauthorised access.
